OUR VISION

Transportation is essential to the well being of all Canadians. We all need a safe, reliable and sustainable transportation network that links our communities and connects us to our business partners.

Transport Canada is the Department responsible for developing transportation policies and programs that ensure a safe and secure, efficient and environmentally-responsible transportation system for Canadians.

OUR ROLE

Transport Canada works hard to keep Canada's transportation system among the safest in the world. We develop and enforce safety and security regulations, and promote ways to identify, prevent or reduce risks and threats to Canadians. Our programs help make Canada's economy strong by creating jobs and attracting business, trade and tourism.

We are also working hard to help reduce greenhouse gas emissions and the air, land and water pollution directly linked to road, rail, air and marine transportation.

To this end, we are accelerating the Clean Air Agenda through new transportation emission regulations. We are also advancing trade and competitiveness through the transportation system and strengthening transportation safety and security. In the air transportation sector, for example, Transport Canada is enhancing the screening of passengers and non-passengers and implementing an air cargo security-screening program.

Transport Canada's 5,300 employees work across the country to ensure that Canadians have access to the safest and most secure transportation network, in which the public can have continued confidence.

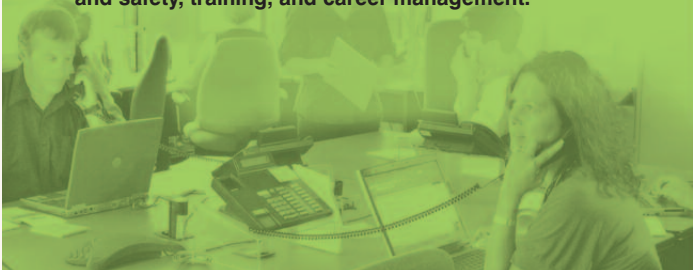

SURFACE - RAIL TRANSPORTATION AND TRANSPORTATION OF DANGEROUS GOODS

WHAT WE DO

The Surface Transportation Directorate ensures that shippers, carriers, dangerous goods consignees and railway companies respect safety standards. We intervene through an inspection and audit program that rests on a risk-based management approach. Conducting investigations and enforcing regulations are integral parts of our functions, namely in the following areas:

- Railway operation (respecting the indicated speed, signals, etc.), occupational health and safety (for employees working on the trains) and railway equipment (mechanical condition of the cars and locomotives)
- Signal (switching and level crossings) and railway engineering (geometry, track defects, rail wear)
- Transportation of dangerous goods – compliance of the packaging, documentation and safety marks, implementation of emergency response plans, responding to accidents, etc.

The Programs Directorate oversees the implementation of policies and programs related to operating and maintaining 40 airports and ports in the Québec Region. We transfer ownership of local port facilities according to the National Marine Policy and manage the Airport Capital Assistance Program (ACAP). We monitor the leases of two international airports and the compliance of five Canadian port authorities.

We make every effort to ensure that our transportation network is sustainable and respectful of the environment. To that end, we manage contaminated sites, perform environmental assessments and promote sustainable transportation.

The Civil Aviation Directorate manages a complete inspection and assessment program to ensure compliance with regulatory requirements. We monitor all aspects of the air transportation system and promote a shared commitment with industry stakeholders to constantly improve safety. We also develop and implement policies and regulations using a systems approach to managing risk for the safest civil aviation system for Canada and Canadians.

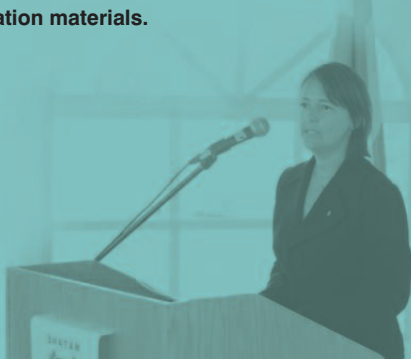
